The Pastor's Peace

Love is patient; **love** is kind; **love** is not envious or boastful

or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on it's own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things....**Love** never ends.

In a time when there is so much divisiveness, perhaps what the church and those who call the church home can best offer is love.

In a 2019 posting in ProgressiveChristianity.org entitled Perfecting Love, Rev. James Burklo shares: "Perfect love cast out fear." If we take this time from the first letter of John seriously, it leads us to an enlightened personal and communal morality. Border walls will not cast out fear. A nuclear arms race will not cast out fear. Radically restricting immigration will not cast out fear. Keeping a gun in the house will not cast out fear. Rubbing our hands all the time with sanitizer will not cast out fear. What will cast out fear? Knowing our neighbors and showing them kindness. Welcoming strangers. Directing open, warm curiosity toward other people and toward all beings and things, even those that at first glance may seem disturbing. Practicing God—that is, practicing Love—attracts us to kindness and distracts us from fear. And by practicing Love, we will make the world a lot less scary. Because so much of what is scary in this world is the result of people trying to deal with their fears in ways that are scarier than the stuff they were scared of in the first place."

I pray that we as a faith community continue to seek ways in which we choose **love** over hate, **love** over fear, **love** over the unknown. May it be so.
