Pastor's Peace:

I have come to experience Advent as an intentional period of waiting and praying for God's reign of justice and restoration to be more fully realized in the world. This season is not just about waiting, but about actively working towards overturning injustice through acts of love and compassion. The season emphasizes God's presence in the world's difficulties and the invitation to "get low" through humility, grief, and prayer, rather than escaping the world. Practices like daily reflection, contemplation, and reading scripture are used to counteract the stress of the holiday season and to find "more of God" in the waiting. Every Advent season we lift up the themes of Hope, Peace, Joy and Love. Friends, we are called to not simply hear and sing about these themes but to also identify and dismantle systems of injustice within our communities and throughout the world and to be "Emmanuel" action to our neighbors. Indeed to continue stiving to be a movement of healing and wholeness for a hurting and fragmented world.

This year we have been gifted Advent worship resources by Rev. Andra Moran. Some of you may recall Andra when she attended this church as a child while visiting her grandparents every year. Andra is now a prominent worship leader within the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) when it comes to both creative experiences and writing meaningful music for today's church setting. She is the co-founder, along with Suzanne Castle, of the BRIM Project which helps teach a way to share the Gospel with freshness, vitality and joy. You will likely notice there is a slight change in order of the Advent themes this year. I invite you to not get so hung up with something being slightly different and instead immerse yourself in the timeless messages of this season and allow God to engage with you.

The Mansfield Christian Unofficial Children's Hospitality Ministry by Rev. Andra Moran

Did you know that in the 1980s, Mansfield Christian Church had a remarkable Unofficial Children's Hospitality Ministry? I do, because I experienced it first hand! My name is Andra Moran, and I'm the granddaughter of longtime member Nada Schweyer, and daughter of longtime member Rev. Dr. Ruth Ann Schweyer Moran.

Our family has been farming in Jeromesville for generations, but my mother moved away to go to seminary at Yale Divinity School. She married Geoff, an Army Chaplain, and had two daughters, me and my sister Sarah. Our family moved around every year or two with the military, and the one constant in our lives was coming to the farm for at least a month every summer to spend time with our grandmother.

Grandma Schweyer took us to church every Sunday, and VBS during the week, too. I can remember the little sugar wafer cookies and the songs, sung in a circle in the fellowship hall. I remember the hymns, too— standing with my grandmother as she sang alto, and following along with the congregation singing the melody. These songs were tiny seeds, planted into the fertile ground of my growing faith.

Muriel Bayer was my favorite Sunday School teacher and provided a consistent, loving presence in my faith formation every summer. As I search my memories now as an adult in midlife, I can't so much see her face as I can feel it— someone outside my own family *loved* me at church, and made sure I knew it. Remember Maya Angelou's famous teaching: People will forget what you said and did, but they will always remember how you made them feel.

I think the chair of the Unofficial Children's Hospitality Committee must have been the Tootsie Roll Man. I don't know his name, but he often wore a green suit and always had pennies and tootsie rolls in his jacket pockets. Whenever he'd seen us kids coming in the door for church he'd say, "Oh, I'm glad you came! I've got something for you!" Quick as a wink, he'd hand us a tootsie roll and a penny and say "Jesus loves you!"

As we grew older, we were invited to tag along on youth group trips and outings to go hiking or canoeing at Mohican State Park and other adventures! The youth group leaders were so very kind and welcoming to us, even as we came and went through the years. People will remember how you made them feel.

Isn't it amazing how powerfully feelings and experiences take root in our lives? I have grown up to be a minister myself, and my focus is music. I live in Nashville, Tennessee and work as a professional Christian songwriter. How often I recall the gift of the steady, loving presence of the people of Mansfield Christian as I think about how I was formed as a young person. Our military life of moving here and there meant that the Mansfield congregation was my primary church family. Even when we lived overseas in Germany, I could feel the love of our Mansfield church.

Christa Storch, a remarkable embodiment of compassion and dedication, left world on Sunday, October 26, 2025, at the age of 53.

Christa was preceded in death by her father Harold Ricky Fout, stepfather Bruce Edward Wilson, cousin James Edward Shaner II (Jamie), and grandmother Bertha Fout.



Christa is survived by her husband Steven Mark Storch (Los Lunas, NM), daughter Allison Renae Storch (Durham, NC), brother Eric Wilson (Hilliard, OH), stepmother Peggy Suellen Fout (Pataskala, OH), mother-in-law, Sandra Stout (Mansfield, OH).

Born Christa Renae Fout on February 2, 1972, she devoted her life to serving others, particularly through her unwavering commitment to her family and local church, Los Lunas Cornerstone Church of the Nazarene (Los Lunas, NM).

Christa grew up in Lithopolis, OH a suburb of Columbus, the state capital. Christa graduated from Teays Valley High School in 1990 and after being accepted to Ashland University (Ashland, OH), graduated in 1994 with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Toxicology, Biology and Chemistry. In high school, Christa had many friends and did several activities including marching band and orchestra, where she played the flute. Christa also enjoyed horse riding and showing her horse, Pancho. Later in college, Christa was an active member of her sorority Alpha Phi. Through Alpha Phi, Christa participated in Community Care volunteerism on campus and worked in the game room. She was also recognized by Beta Beta Beta (National Honors Society in Biology) and was on the homecoming court her senior year.

Christa went on to have a successful career in Pre-Clinical Pharmaceutical research as a Senior Quality Assurance Auditor at Battelle Memorial Institute in Columbus, OH until 2005 and then Lovelace Respiratory Research Institute in Albuquerque, NM where she worked until 2013. Following her professional career, Christa elected to stay home to homeschool her daughter.

In 2001, Christa was married to Steven Mark Storch (from Mansfield, OH) in a beautiful ceremony at a resort in Nigril, Jamaica. She settled down with Steve in Canal Winchester, OH. In 2002, they were blessed with the birth of their only child, a daughter, Allison Renae Storch. In 2005, Christa relocated with her family to Los Lunas, NM where she and her husband had accepted jobs at a research facility on Kirtland Airforce Base, Albuquerque, NM. While the transition to New Mexico was challenging in the beginning, Christa ultimately embraced her new home and surroundings by finding connection, purpose in relationships with neighbors, church congregates and work colleagues. There Christa and Steve made a home for the next 20 years.

Christa's passion for volunteerism shone brightly throughout her life. She engaged in numerous roles that shaped the hearts and minds of those around her through the New Mexico District Church of the Nazarene. Christa held several positions at Los Lunas Cornerstone Church of the Nazarene which included: Church Secretary, Church Treasurer, Church and Daycare Administrative Assistant, Kids Church Teacher, Teen and Children's Bible Quizzing Director, Worship Team Member, Board member and Pastoral Support.

Christa had an array of interests that brightened her life. She held a special place in her heart for Disney World, frequently sharing this love with her family and close friends who made frequent trips to the "Most Magical Place On Earth." Concerning music, she enjoyed included artists such as Twila Paris, Amy Grant, Garth Brooks (Friends in Low Places), Pink and Taylor Swift as well as Praise and Worship music in general. Some of her favorite movies included: Ground Hog Day, When Harry Met Sally, Pretty Woman and Dirty Dancing. She did not like Horror or Suspense Thrillers.

Christa was a health-conscious individual, she enjoyed BeachBody (BODi) workouts and supplements so much she had a small side business coaching clients and promoting supplements and products. She worked with a team of coaches across the country and participated in several rallies, promo trips and even a cruise (Florida, Mexico, Cayman Islands) for coaches and sales members. To ensure her body reflected a healthy lifestyle Christa enjoyed eating "clean" and found several recipes with whole-food, non-processed ingredients. At-home workouts and daily walks through her neighborhood were common for Christa. This dedication to healthy living and fitness fueled her lifestyle of motherhood, service to others, and volunteerism.

Christa also enjoyed long rides on a touring motorcycle with her husband where they would take long weekend rides through the Desert Southwest Mountains (NM, AZ, CO, UT), seeing the sites, incredible natural beauty, small towns and wildlife. Christa enjoyed meeting people on these trips, enjoying local customs/cuisine and collecting keepsakes and many memories. Both Christa and Steve loved these shared adventures.

Christa's greatest achievement was as a mother to her beautiful daughter Allison. Homeschooling her part-time 2008 to 2012 and full-time from 2013 until 2021, Christa was a devoted mother who would stop at nothing to give her daughter every chance to excel and experience the world. Christa volunteered as an assistant Girl Scout leader in Girl Scout Troop 10080 with Troop Leader Angela Sparks (Los Lunas, NM). Together they went on several trips, camps, outings, activities, learned numerous skills, taught the girls responsibility, instilled a strong work ethic (selling cookies, volunteerism) for achieving goals and civic responsibility along with making many, many beautiful, fun memories. The girl's favorite was the RV trips. They would rent an RV, pick a state, and tour the many interesting sites throughout on a weeklong adventure. Christa cherished these adventures, challenges, and many good memories. Additionally, Christa while leading the local church kids and teen Bible quizzing teams went on many trips for competitions throughout New Mexico, West Texas, Arizona and California. She was able to impact many lives and make numerous, close friendships which she cherished.

Christa had a knack for collecting/hanging on to clothes and notes from high school, college and outings which reflected her appreciation for sentiment, good memories, and friendships. Christa's favorite color was purple throughout her life but embraced pink as a sign of her evolving tastes. Additionally, Christa, who while living in Ohio thought common black pepper from a shaker could be too spicy, developed a taste and love for New Mexico Green Chile. The combination of the heat and flavor became a favorite for her. She would add it to eggs, pizza, soup, and was a must on any traditional New Mexican dish.

Christa Storch will be profoundly missed by her husband, family, friends, and all whose lives she touched with her kindness and selflessness. Her legacy of service, love, and devotion will continue to inspire those who follow in her footsteps.

"Merry Christmas"

The Christmas Season is upon us. It is the time of year where families and friends are most caring and practice the tradition of gift giving and generosity. Unfortunately, there are those who view the holiday season as a time of opportunity to burglarize your home, your car and your person.

Here are a few tips of what they look for when shopping for a house to burglarize. This information will help you better enjoy the holidays with more "peace on earth".

- <u>Burglars look for occupancy cues</u> like outdoor lights burning 24 hours a day, piled up newspapers, or advertising flyers hanging on the door knob. Use an inexpensive light timer when you are away and ask a neighbor to keep the front of your home clean of papers and debris. Leave a car in the drive visible to anyone who may be scouting the area.
- Burglars know to look for the hidden door key near the front entrance.
 Don't hide spare keys under rocks, in flowerpots, or above door ledges/mats. Instead give the spare key to a trusted neighbor. If your hiding place is on the list change it!
- Burglars prefer to enter through unlocked doors or windows. Sliding
 windows that are not secure can be seen from distance. One holiday
 problem can occur when exterior Christmas light extension cords are run
 inside through a window and prevent it from being secured. Hire an
 electrician or handyman to install an inexpensive exterior outlet for your
 holiday lights.
- <u>Don't post your Family name on your mailbox</u> or on your house. A burglar can call directory assistance to get your phone number and call your home while in front of your house to confirm that you are away.
- After Christmas day, don't pile up empty gift boxes from your new computer, DVD play, or Flat Screen on the street for the garbage man. Burglars appreciate knowing that you have expensive gifts inside. Break them down or cut them up to conceal the items better.
- Use your alarm system every time you leave.
- <u>Fortify your home</u> by installing solid core doors, heavy duty locks, longer screws in the lock strike plates and door hinges, and install secondary security devices on all accessible sliding windows and doors.
